



## TEXAS BOOK FESTIVAL CELEBRATES LITERARY PROGRAMMING WITH LIT CRAWL AUSTIN

*Annual Night of Literary Mayhem to Expand with New Venues, Shows, and Participating Organizations on November 4*

**AUSTIN, Texas (Oct. 25, 2017)** – The annual Lit Crawl Austin returns to the Texas Book Festival in East Austin on Saturday, November 4, starting at 6:30 p.m. The literary pub-crawl, co-hosted by Texas Book Festival and the Litquake Foundation, features some of the country's best writers onstage at various East Cesar Chavez venues, including neighborhood bars, a cyclery, and a coffee shop, in a series of offbeat readings, literary games, all-ages storytelling sessions, and performances. Appearances include Dan Chaon, Eileen Myles, Kristen Radtke, Tillie Walden, and more.

Inspired by San Francisco's long-running Lit Crawl and produced with their participation, the 2017 Lit Crawl Austin will take place at The North Door, Fast Folks, Flat Track Coffee, Weather Up, Stay Gold, and Resistencia Books.

Highlights include an epic round of Literary Death Match featuring authors Melissa Febos, Ladee Hubbard, Simeon Marsalis, and Rakesh Satyal, a poetic demonstration against police violence featuring poets Amanda Johnston and Mahogany Brown, a mini Pun-Off with authors, noir readings with crime fiction authors, and Lit Crawl Against Humanity.
