



TEXAS BOOK FESTIVAL TO HOST READING ROCK STARS LITERARY PRESENTATIONS

Famed Children's Authors to Perform at T.A. Brown Elementary School on November 4

WHAT: The Texas Book Festival will host one of its annual Reading Rock Stars presentations on Friday, November 4 at T.A. Brown Elementary School. Beginning at 8 a.m., the school will host three authors who are part of the 2016 TBF Weekend Lineup—Yuyi Morales, Steven Weinberg, and Nathan Hale—to present their books for students.

The Texas Book Festival's Reading Rock Stars literacy program brings books to life for children in low-income schools, and they will host authors from across the country at six local Central Texas schools in 2016. The authors will present their literary works in an entertaining fashion. The Texas Book Festival gives each student an autographed copy of each book and provides the school library with a new set of books.

After the 2016 TBF weekend, Reading Rock Stars will have coordinated more than 330 author visits and provided more than 76,000 books to students in Title I schools, since its inception.
