



## TEXAS BOOK FESTIVAL REVEALS FIFTEEN AUTHORS FOR 2021 HYBRID FESTIVAL

*The 2021 hybrid Festival will feature Amor Towles, Sandra Cisneros, Colson Whitehead, Elizabeth McCracken, and R. J. Palacio, among others*

**AUSTIN, TX (July 21, 2021)** - The Texas Book Festival is excited to unveil fifteen authors joining the weeklong hybrid Festival this fall.

The Festival will feature Pulitzer Prize–winning author **Colson Whitehead**, Michener Center for Writers instructor **Elizabeth McCracken**, bestselling novelist and 2016 Kirkus Prize finalist **Amor Towles**, National Medal of Arts recipient and 2005 Texas Writer Award recipient **Sandra Cisneros**, bestselling children’s author **R. J. Palacio**, and many more.

Starting October 25, the weeklong hybrid Festival will include a robust, diverse lineup of established, emerging, and debut literary talent for readers of all ages. TBF’s full lineup will be completed and revealed later this summer.

“We are so happy that authors and readers connected with one another through TBF programming last year,” says Claire Burrows, TBF deputy director, “and now we’re thrilled to introduce just a few of the authors that will participate in the 2021 Texas Book Festival. We want to bring these incredible voices to you wherever you are, whether you’re on Congress Avenue in downtown Austin or at home in El Paso.”

**Amor Towles**, whose bestsellers *Rules of Civility* and *A Gentleman in Moscow* have sold more than four million copies, will present his third novel *The Lincoln Highway*, a multi-perspective story that takes place over ten days and hundreds of miles in 1950s America. **Elizabeth McCracken**, whose *Thunderstruck & Other Stories* won the 2014 Story Prize, will present new book *The Souvenir Museum*, a short-story collection exploring the strengths and fragilities within familial bonds.

Two-time Pulitzer Prize winner and bestselling author **Colson Whitehead** will present his latest work *Harlem Shuffle*: part heist novel, part family saga, and all of it a love letter to early-1960s Harlem. Celebrated bestselling author of *The House on Mango Street*, **Sandra Cisneros**, will present *Martita, I Remember You / Martita, te recuerdo*, an intimate tribute to youthful friendships that transcend time. R. J. Palacio, author of the #1 *New York Times* bestseller *Wonder*, will present her latest book *Pony*, a story set in mid-1800s America about a young boy’s epic horseback journey.

"It's a creative time in the literary events space," says TBF literary director Matthew Patin. "We're in an in-between era, and having both virtual and in-person formats gives us the

opportunity to host conversations among authors and readers in whichever way they prefer. And with so much talent coming to TBF this year, including the authors in this sneak peek, those conversations will be many."
