



## **TEXAS BOOK FESTIVAL BRINGS READING ROCK STARS AND REAL READS PROGRAMS TO DALLAS/FORT WORTH SCHOOLS MARCH 24-25, 2022**

*Texas Book Festival Returns to DFW Area for Seven School Visits, Presenting Eleven Authors and illustrators and Donating 2,400 Books to Students*

**AUSTIN, TX (March 22, 2022)** – On March 24 and 25, the Texas Book Festival returns to the Dallas-Fort Worth area to visit six elementary schools as part of the Festival’s annual Reading Rock Stars program. Throughout the two days, ten nationally-acclaimed children’s authors and illustrators will visit each school and present to students, a culmination of weeks of each school’s preparation for the program. Additionally, TBF will gift each student a copy of the visiting author or illustrator’s book.

TBF will donate 2,400 books to classrooms at Frank Guzick Elementary School, N.W. Harlee Elementary School, Dr. MLK Jr. Arts Academy in Dallas and Meadowbrook Elementary School, Van Zandt-Guinn Elementary School, and Bill J. Elliott Elementary School in Fort Worth. With this latest round of Reading Rock Stars, the Texas Book Festival will have given more than 133,000 books to students in elementary schools across Texas since the program’s inception.

The Texas Book Festival’s Reading Rock Stars literacy program brings books to life for children in elementary schools by inviting authors and illustrators into classrooms with entertaining presentations that inspire students to read, write, and create. Thanks to generous support from sponsor H-E-B and many individual donors, the Texas Book Festival gives each student an autographed copy of their author’s book and provides the school library with a new set of books by the visiting Reading Rock Stars authors. After each presentation, the author personally hands an autographed copy of their book to each student.

This year’s Reading Rock Stars DFW authors include award-winning author and illustrator and 2021 Texas Writer Award recipient Don Tate, who will be giving students a copy of *Pigskins to Paintbrushes*, the inspiring story of Ernie Barnes, who defined himself on his own terms and pushed the boundaries of “possible,” from the field to the canvas. Award-winning author Angela Shanté will present *When My Cousins Come to Town*, a fun, lively story of Black family and cousin culture that celebrates individuality and embraces differences.

Acclaimed author, Kalynn Bayron, will be joining Skyline High School students for Real Reads, Texas Book Festival’s program that focuses on connecting authors and their work with teens. Students received copies of Bayron’s book, *This Poison Heart*, a 2021 Cybils Award nominee

and ProjectLIT Book Club selection, which they have been reading over the past few weeks. On March 24, those students will have the opportunity to engage with the author about the story and her writing process.

“We are thrilled to be back in Dallas and Fort Worth for Reading Rock Stars and Real Reads,” says TBF School & Community Programs Coordinator Michelle Hernandez. “Reading Rock Stars and Real Reads are the culmination of the partnership and collaboration between school librarians and teachers, authors, and Texas Book Festival staff to bring an exciting and memorable experience to students focused on reading, writing, and the joy and magic of books.”
