



Application for 2024 Texas Book Festival Collections Enhancement Grant

General Instructions for 2024 Grants

Texas Book Festival accepts applications from Texas public libraries. Only complete applications will be considered. Libraries that do not submit their final reports for past library grants in a timely manner will not be considered during the current application cycle. All grant applications will be reviewed by a committee selected by the Texas Library Association and Texas Book Festival.

When to Apply

The Texas Book Festival has one funding period per year for Library Grants. For the 2024 cycle, applications will be accepted no later than **April 26, 2024**.

We fund Collections Enhancements Grants

Texas Book Festival's vision is to inspire Texans of all ages to love reading. Through TBF's Collections Enhancement grants, Texas public libraries can upgrade or increase book collections, Ebooks, audiobooks, and special collections in support of community needs.

Note About Ebooks and Audiobooks

Ebook and audiobook subscription services and the individual purchasing of Ebooks and audiobooks may be funded if the library already has a subscription service and/or e-readers established. If the library is seeking funding for Ebooks and/or audiobooks, the library must include details about its current e-readers and subscription services in section 1A of the grant application. As the purpose of the TBF Collection Enhancement grants is to enhance public content through sustainable collections, TBF funds should not be used to initiate e-content subscriptions when no history of ongoing funding is present.

Final Report Submission

If an award is granted, it is agreed that the grantee will complete the Texas Book Festival Final Report and submit it no later than March 1, 2025 by email to michelle@texasbookfestival.org.

Grant Writing Tips

1. Fill out the application electronically and ensure it is complete. Please do not fill out the application by hand.
2. Be specific and direct.
3. Check your spelling and grammar.
4. Demonstrate your community's need and how you will fulfill this need with the grant funds. Who lives in your community? Are all community members' needs being met by your current collection? (consider language and diversity among other needs and interests)
5. Do not assume that the evaluator is a librarian—refrain from using library terminology.
6. Provide a concise budget and attach quotes from vendors to show what your actual costs will be. If requesting physical books for your collection, we highly recommend and will award additional points to applications if using a vendor that will provide you with shelf-ready books. This way, the books are processed quickly and available to patrons. Consider using the *School Library Journal* for average prices if you cannot obtain actual vendor quotes and note why you cannot obtain actual vendor quotes.
7. Provide a timeline of your project, including when you will order items, receive them, implement them, and promote them to your desired community.

8. Provide community statistics to show your needs and how the project will address those needs.
 9. When demonstrating your publicity plan, make sure you are sharing within and beyond your library space. Please share how you will reach your audience to promote the project and the Texas Book Festival award.

Funds may be requested for the purchase of physical books OR e-content, including audiobooks or Ebooks. Your request should not include a mix of physical books and e-content.
